

Top 10 Questions to Ask a Child Custody Evaluator



<u>Before you hire a family law professional</u> it is essential that you prepare a list of questions to ask. The better prepared you are, the more likely it is that you will make a good decision regarding who to work with.

- 1. Are you a mental health professional or some other professional?
- 2. How long have you been completing child custody evaluations? In that time approximately how many evaluations have you completed? What percentage of your practice involves child custody evaluations?
- 3. Are you a member of the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts, the Association for Conflict Resolution, or the Alternative Dispute Resolution section of a Bar Association?
- 4. Do you abide by the standards of practice set out by the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts in *Model Standards of Practice for Child Custody Evaluation?*
- 5. Will I be working with you directly? If not, who will handle my case? When can I interview that person?
- 6. What do you charge/hour? Are there different billing rates for the different types of work that you might do for my case (e.g. going to court)? Will I get a detailed invoice from you on a monthly basis?
- 7. In total what is your estimate as to what my case will cost? What is your policy on setting up a payment plan? Do I need to pay a retainer? Can you please explain your retainer policy?
- 8. Is your professional license in good standing?
- 9. Do you have malpractice insurance?
- 10. What will you expect of me? How can I help to bring these problems to an end in a way that is good for the whole family?
